Allied Health Professions Australia (AHPA) is the peak body and national voice for allied health professions. Through our allied health member organisations we represent more than 130,000 allied health professionals.

Allied health professionals are tertiary-qualified health professionals who together make up almost a third of Australia's health workforce but also have important roles in disability, aged care, social services, education and justice.

AHPA works with government departments and agencies, and other organisations, providing the allied health sector's collective insights and perspectives and promoting the value of allied health.

What are the benefits of being an AHPA member?

Allied health professions are diverse and work in diverse settings, but together we can strengthen the voice of allied health, initiate change, and improve the access of Australians to allied health services.

AHPA works closely with our allied health member organisations to understand and advocate on key issues for allied health professions, and to support their own capacity to undertake advocacy.
